

Memorex Corp. Scheduled To Show Its Newest OEM Rigid Disk Drives

SANTA CLARA, CALIF. — Memorex Corp.—displaying at the NCC for the first time as a Burroughs Corp. subsidiary—will feature the newest additions to its OEM disk drive product line at the show.

Six rigid disk drives will be displayed by Memorex, including the company's new 8-inch

Winchester disk drives.

The new 8-inch drives, which are licensed from Fujitsu Ltd., are the 24-Mbyte Model 112 and 48-Mbyte Model 114, each with minifloppy-compatible interfaces and average access times of 70 milliseconds. The 48-Mbyte Model 213 and 84-Mbyte Model 214 have SMD- or ANSI-

compatible interfaces and 20-millisecond average access times.

Memorex said pricing information for all new drives will be available at the show.

Also to be exhibited for the first time will be Memorex's Model 310 5-1/4-inch Winchester disk drive. The Model 310, licensed from Nippon Peripherals Ltd., stores 10 Mbytes of unformatted data on three disks and is said to be compatible with Seagate Technology's ST506 drive.

Transfer rate is 5 Mbits per second, and average access time is either 95 or 175 milliseconds, depending on which version of the drive is being utilized.

Rounding out the Memorex display will be its Model 677 removable-pack 14-inch drive. The Model 677 is a 300-Mbyte drive with an SMD interface and an average access time of 28 milliseconds. OEM-quantity price is said to be less than \$10,000.
