# San Tomas Open House:

May 22nd, 9 a.m. -- 4 p.m. Arrangements for the Open House at the San Tomas site are nearly complete.

An extensive tour through the Building 10 manufacturing departments has been mapped out, and several displays are planned for areas adjacent to the tour route. ## **Telephone Reminder**

Wide Area Telephone Service (WATS) covering Southern California only has been installed at our Centrex switchboard. Any individual who places long distance calls to Southern California in area codes 213, 714, or 805 should now use our WATS lines rather than long distance.

You can access the WATS lines by dialing "O"; if a line is available the operator will give you the line and you may dial your call in the normal manner. (For example, you would dial 213-xxx-xxxx.)

If all lines are busy the operator will take your name and extension and call you back when a line becomes available.

The WATS service has been installed to reduce our telephone costs, but this will only be accomplished if the service is used properly. A few simple rules to follow when using WATS service are:

- Only business calls are to be placed on the WATS
- 2. Plan your call—eliminate unnecessary conversation.
- 3. Keep your calls short—6 to 10 minutes maximum.
- If all lines are busy, be patient. You should never have to wait more than 10 or 15 minutes.

WATS is not a free service—only place calls necessary to the business of Memorex. With a little effort, we can eliminate all long distance charges to Southern California.

The switchboard is open from 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday to handle your WATS calls.

# Family Day at Roaring Camp


MAG has also obtained special tickets for the steam train ride through the redwoods at Roaring Camp in Felton (Santa Cruz mountains). The tickets are good from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Sunday, May 23rd.

The price of the special tickets is \$2.00 per person (normally \$3.00), only \$1.00 for children 5 to 15 (normally \$1.75), and free for children under 5.

Steam trains will depart Roaring Camp depot every hour, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Since the 12 noon to 3 p.m. trains usually sell out well before departure time, you can enjoy a more relaxing day by taking the 10 or 11 a.m. or 4 to 5 p.m. trains.

An outdoor chuckwagon barbecue is available at the site (although it is not included in the train ticket price), and there are plenty of picnic spots, and miles of hiking trails.
